His efforts to support these beautiful and vulnerable cats could enable us to buy an automatic camera that allows us to remotely survey and monitor endangered species like the cheetah in the wild.



Michelle Madden and Lorraine Pearson from RBS Southampton raised £250 through taking part in a sponsored skydive. Their efforts could help us run a wildlife monitoring training course for community scouts in northern Kenya.



Laura Beal got busy cooking for Marwell. She made and then sold over 150 jars of marmalade and jams in her local community donating proceeds of £200. Her donation could provide essential CC TV equipment for remotely monitoring our expectant mothers in their living quarters.



Eight boys at Hillingbury Junior School held a cake sale in their break time raising a fantastic £14.50 from sales to their teachers and friends. This donation could buy a pair of loppers or a hand saw to carry out essential habitat management work in the semi-ancient woodland around the park, which provides a home to British wildlife.



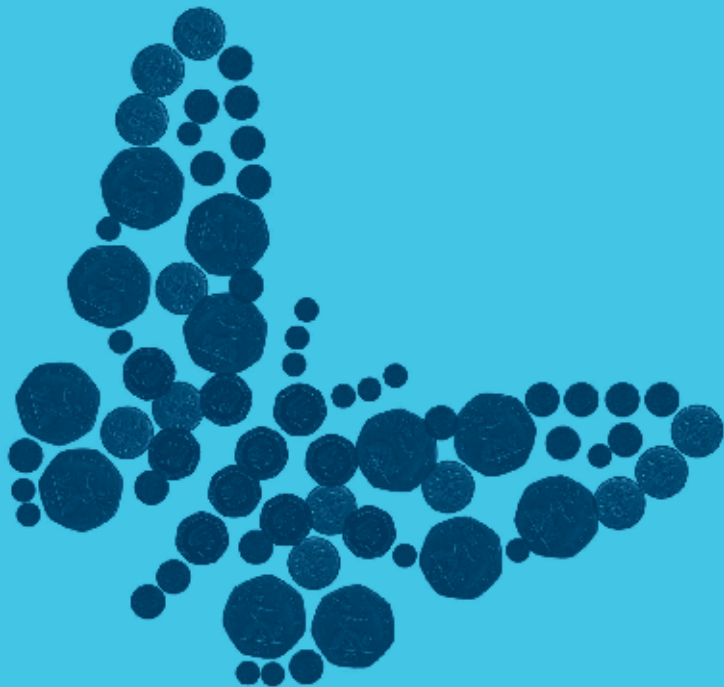

Help Marwell Wildlife in protecting the environment

Encourage and incorporate green travel into your plans, such as public transport or walking and cycling.

If you plan to use posters, flyers or invites, try to make sure the information is printed on both sides of the paper, and use recycled materials where possible.

Try to recycle any rubbish produced from your event. Provide your own labelled recycling bins for cans, paper and plastic and dispose of any left-over food in a compost heap.

If you are planning an event involving food or drink, consider buying local goods and products to cut down your carbon footprint.



Please be aware of the following to ensure that your planned activity is safe and legal.

Please ensure any publicity and fundraising materials that you create yourself include the line: In support of Marwell Wildlife, registered charity 275433.

If you wish to collect money door to door or in a public place, you will need a licence from your local authority. Further details about public collections should be available on your local authority's website.

If you wish to hold a raffle, lottery or sweepstake or a pay-to-enter competition, please observe the strict laws surrounding this type of activity. We would advise you to refer to the Gambling Commission guidance at www.gamblingcommission.gov.uk.

Children (under 16) involved in fundraising must gain permission from their parent or guardian before taking part, and must be properly supervised by a responsible adult. Do not let children collect money from strangers.

Your safety is paramount, so consider any health and safety issues around your planned activity. Make sure your venue is safe and obtain appropriate insurance cover. Carry out a risk assessment and make sure all participants are fully briefed about the activity.

If you will be collecting and carrying around money, think of your security and pay it in as soon as possible.
