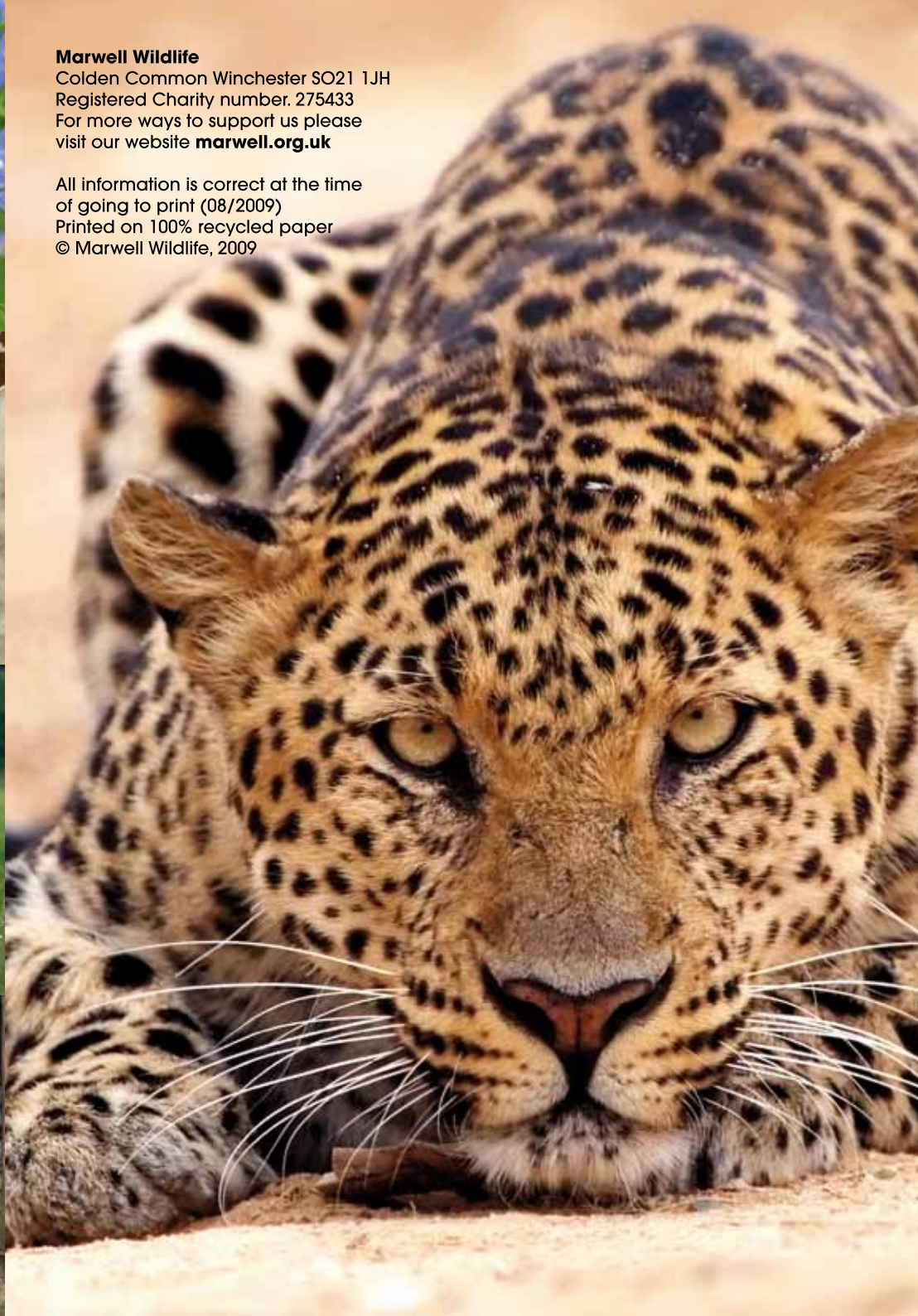

Marwell Wildlife is about connecting people with nature. In everything we do, we seek to encourage understanding, and inspire care for the natural world.

Since our establishment in 1973, Marwell has played an important part in the conservation of endangered species and habitats worldwide including the reintroduction of Scimitar-horned oryx in the Sahara and vital conservation work with Endangered Grevy's zebra in Northern Kenya. Here in Hampshire, our zoological park provides educational opportunities and enjoyment to half a million visitors and students each year.

The breadth and diversity of our work is enormous, as is competition for much needed funding. Legacies are a vital source of funding for Marwell Wildlife and we rely on future legacy gifts, like yours, to ensure our work can continue.

Leaving a legacy to Marwell Wildlife is one of the best ways you can secure a better future for endangered wildlife and habitats for generations to come.

What are the different gifts to consider?

It is only by making a will that you can be sure that a friend, relative or organisation will receive the particular bequest you would like them to. There are several different types of bequests. The main ones include:

A Pecuniary Gift

Leaving a specific sum of money

A Residual Gift

Leaving the total or a percentage of the value of your estate after all other bequests and costs have been deducted

A Specific Bequest

Leaving a particular named item as a gift for example, a piece of jewellery, furniture or a painting.

Making an addition to your will

If you want to add a gift to Marwell Wildlife to your existing will, a codicil is the easiest way to make minor alterations or additions. This can be drawn up by your legal advisor.

£3,000 could provide a Masters scholarship for a conservation student in Kenya working with critically endangered Grevy's zebra.



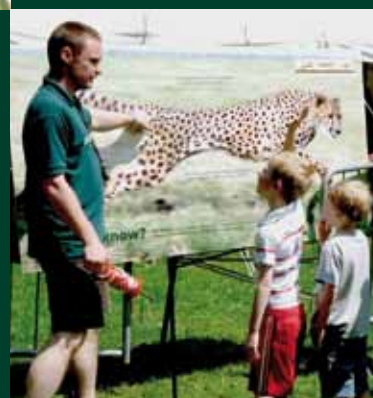
£10,000 could fully refurbish one of our enclosures to further enrich an animal's environment.



£1,000 could provide vital veterinary equipment for larger animals such as our tigers, giraffe and zebra.



£1 million could fund a new exhibit in the park such as a new rhino house and enclosure.



£50,000 could improve our educational facilities which host sessions and workshops on conservation and biodiversity to over 35,000 children and young people each year.
