

ZOO LICENSING ACT 1981

(as amended)

LICENCE TO KEEP A ZOO

WINCHESTER CITY COUNCIL, being the Local Authority under the above Act, HEREBY TRANSFERS THE LICENCE under Section 7(1) to:

MARWELL WILDLIFE

being the occupiers of premises known as

MARWELL WILDLIFE PARK

at Colden Common, Near Winchester, Hampshire, SO21 1JH, which is within the area of the said authority, TO KEEP A ZOO at those premises subject to the conditions endorsed hereon.

This licence, originally issued on the 14th day of January 2019, shall remain in force up to and including the 13th day of January 2025.

MARWELL WILDLIFE

ZOO LICENCE CONDITIONS

Standard Conditions:

Marwell Wildlife must:

- 1. Promote public education and awareness about biodiversity conservation. In particular, provide information about the species of wild animals kept at the zoological park and their natural habitats.
- 2. Accommodate and keep the animals in a manner consistent with the standards set out in the Secretary of State's Standards of Modern Zoo Practice.
- 3. Prevent escapes and put in place measures to be taken in the event of any escape or unauthorised release of animals. In the event of any non-domestic animal escaping from the confines of the zoo, the Licensing Authority shall be notified as soon as possible, and, in any case, not later than 24 hours following the escape.
- 4. Introduce practical measures designed to prevent the intrusion of pests and vermin into the areas within the zoological park where the animals are held.
- 5. Keep up-to-date records of the zoological park's collection, including numbers of different animals, acquisitions, births, deaths, disposals and escapes, causes of deaths and the health of the animals.
- 6. Notify the Licensing Authority in writing, at least one month in advance, of the proposed addition of any animal listed in Category 1 of the Dangerous Animal Categorisation (Secretary of State's Standards of Modern Zoo Practice Appendix 12) which is from a taxonomic family of which Category 1 species have not previously been kept at the zoological park.
- 7. An annual stock list of all animals subject to the Zoo licence must be kept and a copy must be forwarded to the local authority no later than April 1st of the year following that to which it relates and the stock list must include the information and in the format indicated in Section 9.5 of the Secretary of State's Standards of Modern Zoo Practice (09/2004).

8. The licensee to notify the Licensing Authority before the temporary removal from the zoo of any animal listed in Category 1 of the Dangerous Animal Categorisation (Secretary of State's Standards of Modern Zoo Practice - Appendix 12).

Such notifications to be given as early as possible and, in any case, no later than 12 hours before removal unless the zoo operator and Licensing Authority agree a shorter period.

The notification must include details of the destination, method of transportation, the arrangements to ensure the well being of the animal whilst away from the zoo and the measures to be taken to protect the safety of the public.

Note: This does not apply to inter-zoo movements or transfers for veterinary attention.

- 9. Within one month of the date of the licence and one month of the date of renewal of the policy, where applicable, a copy of the zoo's current public liability insurance policy, and of subsequent renewals thereof, to be sent to the Licensing Authority.
- 10. Participate in at least one of the following:
 - i. research from which conservation benefits accrue to species of wild animals;
 - ii. training in relevant conservation skills;
 - iii. the exchange of information relating to the conservation of species of wild animals;
 - iv. where appropriate, breeding of wild animals in captivity; and
 - v. where appropriate, the repopulation of an area with, or the reintroduction into the wild of wild animals.

Marwell Wildlife must keep information to show how it has complied with this condition and supply it to the local authority upon request.
