



## **What Are They?**

Discovery Boxes are giant treasure chests filled with interactive activity ideas and props! The activities help to focus your observations on the animals, as well as finding out all sorts of amazing facts. They meet a variety of learning styles and are especially good for visual and kinaesthetic learners.

There is also usually a separate blue box labelled "For Special Needs Groups" within the Discovery Boxes.

### **How to Book**

Discovery Boxes can be booked **for free**, in half hour time slots, every day of the week. To book a Discovery Box, please <u>click here</u> and select step 2. You can also book Special Needs activities in the boxes.

#### **Scout and Guide groups**

Discovery Boxes are available for Scout and Guide groups to use during weekends and school holidays.

### What is in a Discovery Box?

Inside you will find up to 10 fun activity packs with accompanying props, photos and information, targeted at pupils up to age 11.

Each pack includes instructions (with answers on the back where needed!). These are designed with enquiry skills in mind, so contain open questions which the adult leaders can take to the required level for their pupils.

The activities and instructions are designed so they can be picked up and used straight away, without the need for preparation or research.

Sometimes the props do not fit inside the activity pack folders, but these loose props in the box are clearly labelled.

For SEN groups, there are separate activities in a blue box inside the main Discovery Box.

## Where Are They?

There are six Discovery Boxes around the zoo:

- Penguins at Penguin Cove
- Cheetah at Savannah Tracks
- Giraffe at the giraffe house
- Birds at the walk-through aviary in the Fur Feathers and Scales area
- Rainforests inside the gibbon house.
- Primates next to the red-ruffed lemurs in Life Among the Trees

## What do I do next?

Upon booking, you will be emailed all the information you need, including a padlock combination code to access the boxes. On the day of your visit, simply turn up at your allocated time slot, unlock the Discovery Box, open it and enjoy!

When you have finished using the Discovery box, please put everything back as you found it and lock the box back up again. Please be mindful of your allocated time slot and think about other groups who may have booked.
