

Session Description

This session designed for AS/A-Level students focuses on types of behaviour (both innate and acquired) and gives examples of how and why they are displayed in animals. Together we look at classical and operant conditioning and mention examples of where conditioning is used here at Marwell Zoo, as part of training to assist with animal welfare.

Students are then expected to carry out their own independent behaviour study in the park in the afternoon.
