Post 16 Animal Behaviou Conference



Session Description

This half day conference designed for AS/A-Level students focuses on types of behaviour (both innate and acquired) and gives examples of how and why they are displayed by animals. Together we will look at classical and operant conditioning and mention examples of where conditioning is used here at Marwell Zoo, as part of training to assist with animal welfare. Included is an opportunity to conduct a brief animal study with one of our live animals in the classroom.

The students are then free to carry out their own comparative behaviour study in the park with animals of their choice. This is then followed by a feedback session where the group present their findings in the afternoon.
