Session Description

This half day conservation conference covers key areas around conservation measures including the rationale behind the conservation of animals and some of the work we do, at Marwell in 'Marwell's role in Conservation'.

We discover why genetics are important for species breeding in 'Sex for Survival'.

The final session of the day is the Classification session where we look at how and why we classify organisms. (Please note – This is standard in the February conferences but is on request only for the October conferences)

Session objectives

Develop an understanding of current threats to animal species.

Consider the advantages and disadvantages of different conservation strategies.

Discuss the economic, social and ethical reasons for the conservation of species including consideration of land-use conflicts.
