

Session description

This conservation session focuses on the rationale behind the conservation of threatened species. Together we will explore the role of modern zoos with a particular focus on the aims of Marwell Wildlife.

This informative lesson considers the rationale behind wildlife conservation, outlines some of the methods used for the conservation of animal species and the reasons behind their use. Students give consideration to how organizations including Marwell Wildlife are involved in captive breeding and release programmes, habitat conservation and conservation projects abroad.

Student's gain an understanding of the importance of international co-operation in effective conservation strategies including organizations such as CITES and IUCN.
