

Session Description

This is an interactive KS1 session that uses many real animal artefacts including skins, feathers and whole stuffed animals.

Pupils compare the animals and discuss ways in which they could be grouped according to their similarities. They then assign the artefacts to each of the 5 vertebrate groups. Some of the groups' common features may be discussed, depending on pupil ability. They then get to meet some live animals and are able to touch them to feel for themselves what they are covered in and therefore which of the groups they may belong to.

Learning Objective

To compare a variety of animals and group them according to their structure.
