Supporting nature's recovery, making connections, and sharing our knowledge and experience through our strategy of conservation health are central to the organisation's mission and philosophy. Our holistic strategy and environmental policy are designed to improve performance and efficiency and to encourage responsible behaviour in staff, volunteers, guests, business partners and the communities with whom we interact. We aim to maximise the positive impacts and benefits accruing from the organisation's conservation activities and to reduce or mitigate negative impacts of all activities on the environment.

This is achieved through our Environmental Management System and by ensuring that environmental issues and conservation policies are taken into account in strategic planning and are included in all departmental plans and operations.

Specifically, Marwell is committed to the protection of natural capital and the ecosystem services that support life in all its myriad forms. Marwell will adopt the best practicable approaches to prevent pollution, to reduce or compensate for CO₂ emissions, to ensure the efficient use of energy, water and other resources, to reuse and recycle materials wherever possible and minimise residual material, to manage its grounds and natural habitats in an ecologically sustainable manner and to evaluate and mitigate negative impacts of developments.

Marwell will endeavour to address its impacts in the wider world through sustainable procurement practises as outlined in the Ethical Sourcing Policy and preferring to work with suppliers and contractors that demonstrate similar social and environmental responsibility to ourselves.
