The a. Grevy's zebra, b. plains zebra, and c. Hartmann's mountain zebra. Marwell Zoo is the only place in the UK you can find all three species!











#### Classification

Zebras are mammals. All mammals have a backbone. All mammals have fur or hair at least for part of their lives. All females have glands that can produce milk. Most baby mammals develop inside their mothers (not inside an egg). Mammals are warm-blooded. Can you see any mammals from your home? Any pets? Anything through the window? How about the mirror? (Humans are mammals too)



# Feeding

As their diet is relatively low in nutrition, zebras will spend much of the day grazing on grasses. They will also sometimes eat browse (the twigs and leaves of trees and shrubs).

Plains zebra are often seen grazing in the company of giraffes. It is thought that wild zebras use the giraffes as an 'early warning system' if predators are nearby. This means the plains zebras
