

## **Corporate Engagement Days Clothing Guidelines**

The weather at Marwell can be unpredictable. Come rain or shine, our Corporate Engagement Days will continue to run (unless there are extreme weather conditions), please ensure you dress appropriately. We would also suggest you bring a spare set of clothes that you can change into at the end of your day.

We have provided a list of clothing which would be suitable to wear on one of our Corporate Engagement Days. This is our suggested clothing list, please try to keep to these as much as you can:

- Sturdy Footwear
  - Trainers\* are not suitable.
  - Steel toe capped boots if you own them.
  - Work boots are preferable.
  - Walking shoes, boots or wellies\*\* are good alternatives, depending on the task.
- Gardening Glove
  - We respectfully ask all groups to bring your own gardening gloves.
  - Long trousers. Cargo, combat, sports etc. These will dry off quicker than jeans. o Shorts are not advisable.
- Jumpers, sweat tops, or fleeces.
- Base layer (eg. thermal top in winter) Layers will help in colder conditions.
- Waterproof coat or cagoule
  - Plus, waterproof trousers if you have them.
- Gloves (winter)
  - You will be provided with gardening gloves.
- Wool hat (winter)
- Sunhat (summer)
- Personal medication i.e. antihistamines, inhaler, tablets etc
- Suncream/sunblock (summer)
- Any of your own PPE kit
  - You are welcome to bring your own PPE kit on the day.

\* On arrival, your footwear will be assessed as to whether it is suitable. If it is not suitable, the team will provide you with work boots for the day. You will only be able to undertake certain tasks when the required PPE is available and suitable for your use. Refusal to wear provided PPE will result in the attendee not participating in the tasks for the day.

\*\* Your task may involve being in an area where the ground is wet. It is advised you bring welly boots as your task may move locations throughout the day.

You will be working out in the zoo, or surrounding grounds, regardless of weather conditions. There is a potential that your group may get wet, cold, muddy etc. There's no such thing as



bad weather, but rather bad clothing. Please bring appropriate clothing for your visit, particularly warm and waterproof items.

If you have company t-shirts, high vis vests etc, you are welcome to bring these to wear during your day. Perfect for that photo opportunity!
